DECISION 2008: THE UPCOMING ARRL ELECTIONS

Editor's Note: The following article is a commentary and does not necessarily reflect the opinions of the BVARA or the ARRL.

In an effort to draw attention to upcoming ARRL Division Elections, I published an article by Mickey Cox, K5MC, who is running for Delta Division Director.

Reaction to the article was swift and, to say the least, remarkable.

I received e-mails ranging from, "What do I have against Atlantic Division Director, Bill Edgar, N3LLR?" to "an unsubscribe" from ARRL CEO, Dave Sumner, K1ZZ (nothing like keeping an open mind about things Dave).



the ARRL website. She told me that she would pass that suggestion along to Mr. Sumner.

Gerald, N7WR, posted the following to QRZ.COM concerning K5MC's article:

While I do not live in your Division I am pleased at most of the points in the current version of your platform. I would urge you to take an in-depth look at where the League is headed in terms of Emcomm. It is trying to be all things to all people except the public. It has become so enamored of its partnerships with "government" that it has neglected the people who will need Emcomm the most--the public that in a disaster will be without any form of communications. I also encourage you to continue to focus on the need for a national traffic system but not one built entirely on Winlink.

If you are successful in your effort

to be elected stand by for tremendous arm-twisting by the establishment and, if you fail to play their game, being ostracized by the group. Unfortunately, in my view it will take the election of many new directors with your perspective before much substantive change is likely. In my opinion some staff members who essentially "run" the league have been there way too long. When I was in grad school getting my MS in Administration I vividly recall a professor pointing to a series of studies which indicated that leaders lose their effectiveness and need to move on after 5 years. Far too many ARRL power players have been there far longer than that. If you, and others like you in sufficient numbers, are elected perhaps formerly very active League supporters like myself will return to the fold. Absent that I am a mem-

ber only because I became a Life Member before the League I once knew to be excellent begin its steady slide down hill.

Tim, AB0WR, posted the following to QRZ.COM concerning K5MC's article:

Although I can't vote for you I am with you in heart and spirit. If you can return the ARRL to being an advocate for the common ham instead of for special interests, to being an organization standing for technical excellence in every area (including in FCC petitions), and to being member-oriented instead of leadership oriented you will deserve the accolades of every ham.

I will pledge now that if you are elected I will rejoin the ARRL. I suspect you will be able to bring many more amateurs into the

membership based solely on your platform.

I *do* agree with n7wr, the ARRL has lost sight of the goal of "service to the public" and has sidetracked into trying to make amateur radio into a common carrier providing communications infrastructure for government agencies and for NGO's. That is not an amateur radio service I see as surviving.

I would make this point about the NTS. Learning how to handle formal traffic in a structured environment puts the amateur service in the best position to handle traffic from the individual ham on behalf of the affected public "local" to that individual ham. It is not the best arrangement, necessarily, for being a common carrier for government agencies and for NGO's. I truly believe this is why the ARRL has moved away from being a big advocate for the NTS, including phone, cw, rtty, and psk nets. It is a symptom of a larger problem within the ARRL leadership.

I would also say that probably one of the most important planks in your platform is having open Board Meetings, even if it is only open to a few "reporters". I would add that those reporters should be able to record the Board Meeting and make total transcripts available to the general amateur public. The Board policies, in no way, should be secret. If personnel matters are to be discussed then the Board can go into executive session just as any Board of Education would do in a public session.

I applaud your efforts.

Bill, W7ARC posted the following to QRZ.COM:

Mickey you are right on target. The League needs be more in tune with what the amateur radio operators on a whole want and not just the interests of "special interests". As a ham since 1971 and interested in Ham radio since the early 60's I've seen some very big changes in the content of QST...an not for the better. True the costs of publication has increased and so has the number of advertisements in the magazine but the content of the magazine has in information that the average ham operator should be able to use has decreased proportionally to the increase of the advertisements.

Gone are the days of number of technically based articles and the operational ideas that can be invaluable to those of us who are still engaged in emergency communications or traffic handling. Yes, they still report the Public Service Honor Roll and the Brass Pounders League in the Public Service soapbox; but how many new hams actually know what these are?

Being given a choice of publication is the only fair thing the League should be doing of they are going to represent ALL amateur radio operators in the United States. They should be looking to authors of information who have a track record of being on the leading edge of information and are forward thinking individuals and not just rehashing the same material over and over.

If I were in your section, you would get my vote. Hopefully you would be the voice of reason on the board. We certainly need more like you to steer the League in their attempt to better Amateur Radio for all of us.

Steve, K5OKC, commented on QRZ.COM: I recently had the opportunity to visit my nephews high school. I asked if there was a ham radio club. No, they didn't have that. I asked if they had an electronics club. No, they didn't have that. I didn't try to put them on the spot, I just offered some conversation about how it had motivated me into studying. I think it helped me with my other studies. I had some issues with our teacher and his rules about the ham station, but he offered a challenging course that even included the new invention called a transistor. We also made a 9 volt 1 amp power supply with these new high power diodes.

Fast forward, I think if anyone who wants to be a director of the ARRL, then they should have a deep desire to get kids motivated about radio. You'd be surprised at how building a radio transmitter on a breadboard can still be exciting to someone who has an ipod and a digital camera in their backpack.

We have enough lawyers in the ARRL leadership. We need non-lawyers to preach the excitement of electronics discovery.

RM this or RM that is not enough.

Finally, although I did not have the opportunity to post any comments to QRZ.COM, here are my thoughts and questions concerning some issues that need to be addressed during the upcoming elections:

1. Why are ARRL Board meetings not open to a limited number of observers when non-personal matters are discussed?
2. Does the ARRL have a working Strategic Plan? If so, how does it address the future of our hobby over the next three to five years?
3. I have been told by more than one League official that the ARRL Strategic Plan is a confidential document. Is this true and if so, why?
4. Is eliminating the \$3.00 senior member discount in 2009 part of the ARRL's Strategic Plan or just an attempt to provide a quick fix to a much larger problem?
5. Does the ARRL have specific projections that detail anticipated growth in our hobby? If so, what are these projections and how were they arrived at?

Atlantic Division Director, Bill Edgar, N3LLR, is sponsoring a series of teleconferences/webinars (see page 8 this issue). Wouldn't it be nice if some of the aforementioned issues were discussed during these webinars? Or better yet, I have requested an interview with Bill and I look forward to hearing his response to many of the issues addressed in this article.

In conclusion, I hope that this article is not interpreted as "anti-ARRL." It is the intent of this publication to offer an open forum on issues of interest to the greater amateur community. It is still my opinion that the ARRL is our one best hope in keeping the future of our hobby alive and healthy.





