

From Apollo / Leechburg: Take Rt. 66 S to Rt. 380. Take 380 W to Rt. 366. Take Rt. 366 W (toward New Kensington) to the end of the 4 lane. Go ¼ mile past the end of the 4 lane. Turn right on Whitten Hollow Road. Go about ½ mile to first stop sign. Turn right on Turkey Ridge Road. Go about ½ mile to top of hill. Skyview is on the left.

From New Kensington: Take Rt. 366 E. Go about 5 miles from the Parnassas area. Look for the Hannan Building on the left. Go about 100 yards past the Hannan Building (If you get to the 4 lane, you went too far). Turn left on Whitten Hollow Road. Go about ½ mile to first stop sign. Turn right on Turkey Ridge Road. Enon Valley Community Day with the BVARA and Ham Radio

Tom was using a Wolf River Coil vertical antenna with three deployed radials. When tuned, the SWR dropped down to around 1.2 at the frequency that Tom wanted to use for 40-meter QRP CW operation.

Friday evening, we put up a 90-foot sloping vertical about halfway up a very tall oak tree. Jim's ICOM AH-4 auto tuner did a remarkable job matching that antenna on multiple bands. I used a counterpoise ground that was about 50 feet long on the ground and around the house where we were. SWR didn't even register any return loss values on the ICOM-7300.



15 contacts are in the log on SSB on 20 meters. An ADI file was created from our paper log after the contest. One ham was a VOTA member while many other contacts were operating POTA activations.

An Evolve laptop running Linux Mint was connected to the ICOM-7300 and one or two contacts on 20 meters with FT8 were added to our total contacts at the Enon Valley event. Bob, N3AZZ, Tony, K3AHP, and Doug, K3GTX stopped by and spent some time with us.

100 Years Ago in QST Magazine

Continuing, this issue of our *eQRM Newsletter* and in celebration of our 100th Anniversary of the BVARA, two issues of the 1923 QST Magazine will be featured. A photo of the cover of each issue will be shown as well as a description of two articles within each issue of the magazine.

The cover of the **July 1923** issue of *QST Magazine* by Clyde Darr, 8ZZ shows a rather rotund mailman in full uniform and cap as he personally delivers two handfuls of QSL cards to an eager ham who is sitting by his equipment with his headphones on. He pauses to thank the mailman as he reads the first message on a QSL card. Gone today with LOTW are the personal, hand-written messages from a bygone era. Perhaps a comment field could be added to LOTW?




This issue of *QST Magazine* headlines the ham news of the day with an eight-page feature article entitled *Amateur Radio Shoves Off for the Pole*. The lead photo captures: On board the "Bowdoin," after unpacking the equipment from a mountainous pile of packing cases. ARRL personnel, <u>radio operator D.H. Mix, 1TS</u>, the Zenith design engineer, and the skipper, Dr. MacMillan are shown, clustered around the communications equipment. The article goes on to describe the

equipment, the plan, the route, the receiver, the tuner, the wavemeter, the installation on the "Bowdoin" with practical operating rules. Schedules, messages and deliveries, urgent message handling, and a list of American Newspaper Alliance contacts are described. Rounding out the article is a photo of Dr. MacMillan wearing Arctic furs, ready for a sledge trip.

In another article, *U.S. Will Send Standard Waves for ARRL*, seven frequencies from 425 KHz up to 1500 KHz were to be sequentially broadcast, starting with "QST", then the Standard Wave, and finally followed by announcements via key and voice. Each frequency set would require 11 minutes to complete before moving up to the next higher frequency. The purpose was to enable all within receiving range to calibrate their receivers and wavemeters.

The cover of the **August 1923** issue titled *Local QRM* shows a Commerce Department Radio Inspector sending Morse with a mechanical code machine to a bug-eyed applicant. "10 Words per" is the caption.



With the lead-off article: The Passing of the Pacific, and subtitle: Kangaroo Outclassed as American Amateur Radio Signals Leap to Antipodes, A trans-Pacific event that began at 10:00 PM PST on May 1st and ended at the end of the month was a resounding success. Thus, began the sport of 'yank logging' from Australia and New Zealand. V.M Bitz, 6JD from Los Angeles was the first US station to make a successful contact across the Pacific Ocean during this event.

The Departure of "WNP" from Wiscasset, ME happened in the afternoon of June 23rd, 1923 when the "Bowdoin" set sail for Ellesmere Island. Radio operator D.H. Mix 1TS, who was sponsored by the ARRL, has already been in regular communication on the voyage.
