





Breaking News: . . . 10 meters was wide open on Saturday afternoon, February 5th with not only SSB stations, but also CW and FT8 stations from many parts of the Americas.

In other News: . . . Propagation is improving day by day as well as week by week. Call CQ even if you hear nothing on the band. Everyone just might be listening for you!

15 meters frequently has been opening but a little earlier than 10 meters and closing a little longer than 10 meters.

20 meters has been the 'bread and butter' band during the sunspot minima years. Recently it has been open from sunrise until almost midnight. In another year or two it will be open 24 hours a day.

Digital and CW stations on 30 meters at times opens up to all parts of the world. Try plus or minus two hours around sunrise and again at sundown.

40 meters is always 40 meters. Short skip with 30 over S9 signals and then it goes long. Sometimes as long as Australia and India. Follow the path of darkness.

On 60 meters, one of the channels is filled with FT8 signals.

Want to join a net? 75 meters is the band to go. Make sure you can operate full legal limit so that some of the nets just might let you join them! Watch out for the DX window around 3.79 to 3.80 MHz because you will find some good DX in that window.

On 160 meters, February 25th to 27th is the International Phone Contest.

I think you all know how I always insist on "Safety First"...

Moral of the story, please **be careful** during unusual weather... Think safety.



BVARA Winter Field Day 2022

The first plan was to operate Winter Field Day from an RV on generator power at Brady's Run Park near the ball field. As a result, Winter Field Day was moved indoors to the home of Rich Soltesz.



The Cover Page of the eQRM has a photo of our Field Day Map for 2022. It really filled up! We operated from Rich's home as 2H in Western Pennsylvania. A Flex Radio 6700 was used on 80, 20, 15, and 10 meters. Antennas used for the Flex were a Yagi antenna and a Doublet Long Wire antenna. We additionally used an ICOM 7300 exclusively on 40 meters with a perfectly-matched temporary dipole at 40 to 60 feet above ground.

We had a lovely group for the Field Day event. There was good food, soft drinks and plenty of "Radio Time". Doug, K3GTX, Kathy, and Tim, KA3JRT stopped by to encourage our contesting and put a dent in the many food dishes that had been prepared.
