



### This Month

#### This Month:

*Speaker:* Rich Soltesz, K3SOM *Topic:* Wolf River Coil Antenna System – Part 1 *Including:* 

Continuing with our BVARA Presentation Series this year, our topic this month and next covers a very popular portable base vertical antenna called the *Wolf River Coil Antenna System (WRC)*. In particular, I purchased a Silver Bullet 1000 with the 40- to 10-meter coil and the *Mega Pod* tripod base with 24" legs. The *Take It Along (TIA)* package included three 33' radials as well as a 102" adjustable whip antenna. As I became more familiar with the antenna, I later purchased the 80-meter coil for 80- and 60-meter coverage and two 24" extensions with couplers to try different configurations. With these hardware pieces and my trusty SARK-110 Antenna Analyzer, I was well-armed and ready to expand my portable operations for POTA and SOTA.

We will start with an examination of vertical and mobile antenna configurations that utilize a radiator that is less than a quarter wavelength high. These antennas typically use a loading coil to make the antenna appear to be electrically longer than its physical length. Based on where the coil is placed, whether at the base or higher, we'll examine the effect on SWR, bandwidth, and on efficiency. We'll also look at the effect of ground losses and loading coil losses on bandwidth and efficiency as well as how to conveniently measure the Q for our WRC.

But wait, there's more! In Part 2, we will investigate different types of ground configurations and materials that can reduce ground losses, thus improving power losses and efficiency of our antenna system. As a bonus, some of these materials save considerable time in both setup and breakdown time. If you are a new ham or want to do something different for a change, this is one exciting presentation that you won't want to miss.



Our December VE Testing did not take place because of our planned Christmas Party and Ham of the Year Award ceremony.



# Rabid Raccoon 100 Ultra Ham Radio Volunteers

#### Are Needed

This March 16 & 17 marks the 3rd annual Rabid Raccoon Race where ham radio operators help over **300 runners** and spectators run over 100 miles. Last year they had 50 some people run 100 miles around 356 runner did the 100 kilometers run and the largest group the marathon race.

There are some major changes this year: First, the race has moved to a new park it is now in the Brady Run Park which is an Beaver county park just north of Beaver Falls. The park looks a lot like Raccoon SP with hills and a lake. The Second major change is all the Aid Stations are in buildings this year. So no more tents next to a road with coal trucks zooming by.

#### There are 3 aid stations that you can pick from:

Aid Station #1: Brady Lodge

Aid Station #2 & #3: Four Season Lodge

Aid Station 4: Recreation Hall {Ice Skating Rink & Tennis Court} This is also the Start Finish line.

Since this is an 36 hour long event there are four shifts that you can pick from. You will notice that there even an over night shift the runners run though the night and you will be busy since they will be starting a half marathon at mid-night.

I will then add you to the list and get you on the email list for more detail information as we get closer to March 16 & 17.

Your duties will be just radio communications. Handle the aid station traffic, runner drop outs, restocking needs. The aid stations will have cooks that will feed you and there will be plenty of snacks to feed on. Plus the world famous pickle juice. {Don't worry there others thing to drink, but the runner love it!}
