

As the Governor permits restaurants to function we will be there if the Diner is open.





All classes of amateur radio license tests are administered.




ALL candidates MUST bring ALL of the following:

1. 2 forms of I.D. - one MUST be a photo I.D.
2. A pencil AND a pen with blue or black ink.
3. The original AND a photocopy of any valid ham license.
4. The original AND a photocopy of any C.S.C.E.
5. The test fee of \$15 - cash only.
6. Your FRN Number. (free from the FCC, call for details)

Our May VE Test Session had two candidates, with each participant achieving their goal of passing the exam. Our new electronic filing system worked superbly with the paperwork uploaded to a special ARRL website on Thursday evening, entry information by the ARRL to the FCC on Friday, and new license and an upgrade processed and posted by Saturday morning. A congratulations email was then sent to each candidate with a snippet of their license page for their new callsign and/or verification that all information was entered correctly. Some previous sessions were sometimes late by up to three weeks from delays caused by US Postal Services issues. The paperwork for us no longer has to be mailed in to the ARRL VEC.


Our testing was conducted at our normal location at the Beaver County Emergency Services Center in Ambridge, PA. We are anticipating the continued use of the facility for our VE testing.

I have created a groups.io for the club...

Groups.io is basically an e-mail reflector where people with similar interests can post to a group and members of the group can read and reply to the post. There are numerous groups that a person may want to join. Personally, I subscribe to about 25 different groups that allow me to seek and give advice about several radios I own or am thinking about purchasing, as well as radio programming software, and other hobbies.

For those who already have a groups.io account, just search BVARA or Beaver Valley Amateur Radio and subscribe. I currently have it set up so new members must be approved (by me for now, I can add moderators as necessary).

For those who do not have a groups.io account, signing up is simple. Go to groups.io and create an account using your e-mail address of choice and create a password. Once that is done just search BVARA and subscribe.


Once you subscribe please be patient in waiting for approval in the group.

9:1 UNUN Project Results

In last month's eQRM Newsletter we reported on the final preparations by Jim, KC3IXE and Tony, K3AHP for the 10 kits that were prepared for club members to assemble. The project was based on the excellent construction article that was published in the March 2019 issue of *QST Magazine*.

8 out of the 10 kits have been constructed by members and tested against the prototype that we assembled as the physical template for members to duplicate. All eight kits performed as well as or better from 160 to 10 meters than the prototype. Mick, N3OJL actually deployed his UNUN and measured the SWR on all HF bands using various element and counterpoise lengths.
