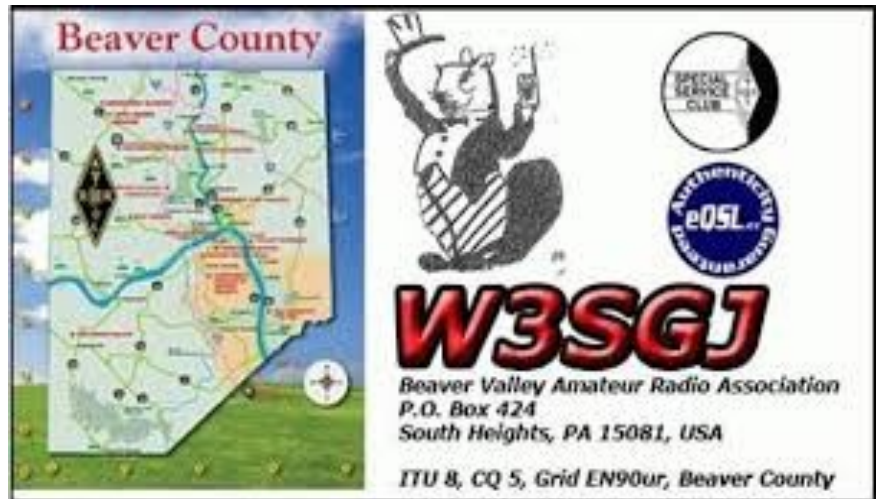

Testing was conducted at our normal location at the Beaver County Emergency Services Center in Ambridge, PA. Our next VE Test Session will be on June 11th, 2026.

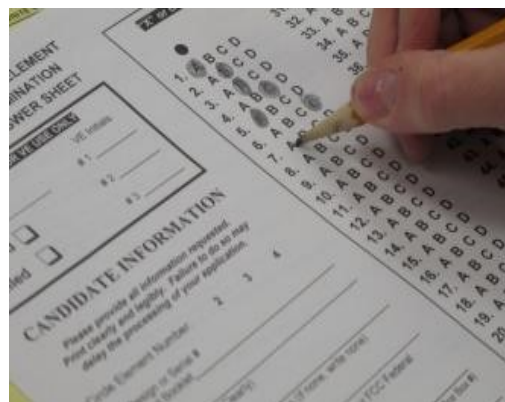

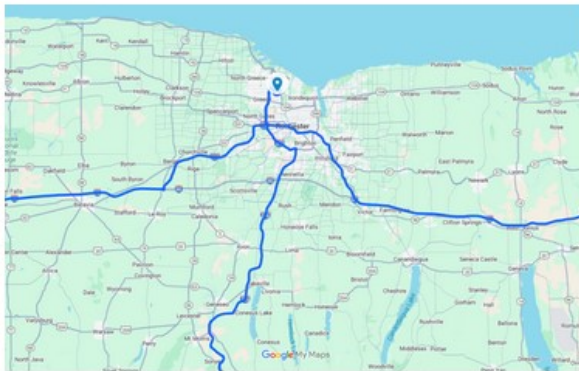


The 93RD Rochester Hamfest Saturday June 20, 2026

This Just In!

(Chippewa Township, PA) An overnight power outage affected residents in Chippewa Township May 30-31, 2026 according to electricity provider FirstEnergy.

The outage began at 11:30 p.m. May 30th and ended just before 7:30 a.m. May 31st.

“This outage is necessary to allow our crews to safely complete important upgrades to a nearby substation, helping improve long-term reliability,” a FirstEnergy spokesperson said in a statement. A social media post on the Chippewa Township Facebook page said FirstEnergy crews are working to transition electric service in the area to a new substation on Wallace Run Road.

Absolutely No QRN on Any HF Frequencies

I always keep flashlights available in several rooms. Good thing, as it instantly turned very, very dark. Well, not completely because my solar walkway lights were still on. Then I remembered the two phone messages announcing the planned outage for equipment upgrades. It was time to deploy the flashlights to useful places like the kitchen, the bathroom, and the bedroom. Done.

Now what? I turned on my Tecsun S-8800 that I had just fully charged with its built-in LiFePO₄ batteries. I could have hooked up a 12-volt battery to my Drake R8B (an oldie, but an exceptional goodie!) but I wanted to see what reception was like.

Suddenly, I felt like I had taken a Time Machine back to what it was like in the 1950s and 1960s, only better. No matter what band I tuned to, including the AM Broadcast Band, international shortwave and ham bands, or WWV/WWVH, there was absolutely no QRN from man-made devices. Only an occasional static crash from a distant storm could be heard trying unsuccessfully to spoil perfect reception. What a refreshing reception situa-

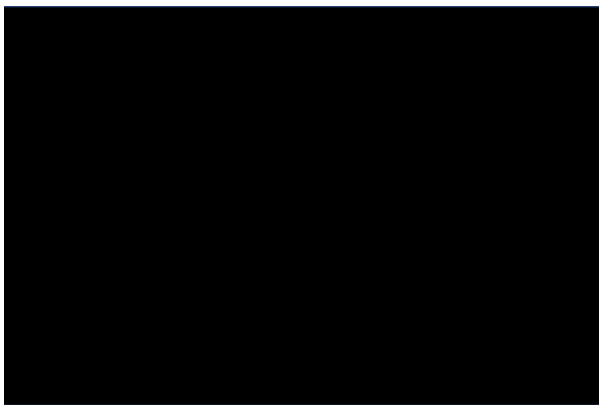
tion! I felt like I had been transported to a spot deep within the Allegheny National Forest. I was very far away from any sources of interference. As a fan of old TV shows like *The Twilight Zone* or *The Outer Limits*, I stayed awake as long as I could hearing an AM station on just about every frequency on the Broadcast Band, including multiple stations on various 'graveyard' frequencies that I could select by rotating the radio. Simply magnificent listening conditions!

When I awoke at about 6:00 AM, the clock/radio was still dark. Yippee, time to hear stations in Asia and the South Pacific. The Sun rose at about 5:50 so I was close to the peak of Gray Line Propagation. What an experience to remember!

Upon reflection, one of the many reasons that hams enjoy activating a State Park or a hiking trail is the absence of man-made radio noise with an improved ability to hear many more stations if the activation site is favorably higher than the surrounding terrain. With so many other reasons to activate a site, no wonder so many people enjoy that style of operating. Without activators, those who choose to be hunters would have a much more difficult time with achieving their goals.
