

- 6. Your FRN Number. (free from the FCC, call for details)




Solar Cycle Progression – Cycle 25

"February was another strong month for Solar Cycle 25. According to NOAA, the average sunspot number was among the highest of the past 10 years.

Originally, <u>forecasters thought</u> Solar Cycle 25 would be about the same as Solar Cycle 24, one of the weakest solar cycles in a century. February's sunspot numbers are the latest sign that Solar Cycle 25 will exceed predictions. In fact, Solar Cycle 25 has outperformed the official forecast for more than 24 months in a row.

Solar Maximum is not expected until 2024 or 2025, so the solar cycle has plenty of time to strengthen even more, bringing X-flares, geomagnetic storms and auroras." From https://www.spaceweather.com/archive.php? view=1&day=02&month=03&year=2023





"In both plots, the black line represents the monthly averaged data and the purple line represents a 13-month weighted, smoothed version of the monthly averaged data. The mean forecast for the current solar cycle (Cycle 25) is given by the red line. . . (The gray shaded region) takes into account expected uncertainties in the cycle start time and amplitude."
