

Matt Heere, N3NWV

Topic:

POTA – What It's All About

Including:

Continuing with our BVARA Presentation Series this year, our topic this month covers a growing Radio-Sport called POTA. Matt Heere, N3NWV, was invited to enlighten us about this exciting activity. Matt was 1st licensed in the early 90's as a Tech Plus Class ham. After a 15-year hiatus from the hobby, he rediscovered ham radio. Matt pulled the old HT out of the box, wondered if it still worked, and threw a call out on the 146.85 machine. There he met Frank, N3TN, and his new ham radio life began as an Extra Class ham.

Matt will be talking about the beginnings of POTA when a nonprofit organization was founded in 2017 to continue POTA and how it has taken off since then. He will then describe the vocabulary that an Activator and Hunter use as well as the rules that help both participants to succeed with their goals. Matt plans to review some very important resources that enhance operating, spotting, and many other aspects of POTA. Depending on the goals of the activator, preparation of not only equipment but also setting up a game plan for multiple activations will be discussed.

Depending on these activator goals, his station has to satisfy the needs of the planned activation. For example, backpacking to a remote site requires much more consideration of equipment weight, what to pack in terms of equipment, power sources, antennas, and so much more. On the other hand, if the chosen park, trail, or State Game Land has a picnic table close to a parking area, station considerations may be completely different.

Matt plans to talk about what kind of 'toys' do these park-goers generally play with. Trade-offs of features Vs. cost always seem to rise, but hams are ingenious and creative when required!

But wait, there's more! Matt has been asked where he feels POTA will change over the next few years. A hobby with a tie-in to technology seems to always be changing as new equipment, new modes, and new concepts arise. This is one presentation you won't want to miss.



Rabid Raccoon 100 Ultra Ham Radio Volunteers Are Needed

This March 16 & 17 marks the 3rd annual Rabid Raccoon Race. Volunteer ham radio operators support the **300 plus runners.** They run a course of over 100 miles. Last year more than 50 people ran 100 miles.

There are some major changes this year. The race location has moved to a new park, it is now in the Brady's Run Park. Brady's Run Park is in Beaver County, just north of Beaver Falls. This park looks a lot like Raccoon State Park with hills and a lake. The Second major change is all the Aid Stations are in buildings this year. Gone are the tents that were dangerously close to the road with coal trucks zooming by.

There are 3 aid stations that you can pick from:

Aid Station #1: Brady Lodge

Aid Station #2 & #3: Four Season Lodge

Aid Station 4: Recreation Hall {Ice Skating Rink & Tennis Court} This is also the Start Finish line.

Since this is an 36 hour long event, there are four shifts that you can pick from. You will notice that there is even an over night shift. The runners run though the night and a half marathon will be starting at midnight.

3:30 AM-1:00 PM // 1:00 PM-10:00 PM // 10:00 PM-7:00 AM // 7:00 AM-4:00 PM

I will then add you to the list and get you on the email list for more detailed information as we get closer to March 16 & 17.

Your duties will primarily be radio communications. The aid stations will have cooks that will feed you. There will be plenty of snacks to enjoy and the "world famous pickle juice". (Don't worry, there are other things to drink, but the runner love the juice!)



Eclipse Map — April 8, 2024 Total Solar Eclipse





A total eclipse for most of the locations within about two hours from where you live may only be visible for one or at most two times within your lifetime. Furthermore, Erie has cloud cover about 62 percent of the time on April 8th. If the weather forecast looks favorable for Northwest Pennsylvania, travel to the area could be the event of your lifetime.

The map (on the next page) shows the visibility in our area of the total solar eclipse on April 8, 2024. The darker band shows the area where the totality of the eclipse can be observed while the lighter bands show where the partial eclipse will be visible.

Below the map are four examples of techniques that can be used to safely view the eclipse without damaging your eyes. Several of the projection techniques are very safe while providing a good view of the eclipse as it progresses.

From the times given above for the area around Erie, PA, the total eclipse time will only last for approximately four minutes. The total event will last for about two and a half hours.





Make a Box Pinhole Projector

Instructions on how to DIY a pinhole projector using a cardboard box and household items to safely see a solar eclipse.



Make a Solar Eclipse Projector

Make a Sun projector a pair of binoculars or a telescope to safely watch solar eclipses or a planet transit.
