

Topic:
FT8 – Take the Plunge

Including:

Continuing with our BVARA Presentation Series this year, our topic this month deals with a digital mode that is setting the bands on fire. It's called FT8 is included in the latest release of WSJT-X by Joe Taylor, W1JT and his colleagues. During the decline of the 10, 12, and 15-meter bands, hams turned their attention to both FT4 and FT8 to snag solid domestic and DX station contacts on almost every HF band with many stations using only 25 watts or less. The POTA phenomenon has created a niche for these modes to easily enhance contact totals. DXpeditions to rare locales are now including resources to further enhance their coverage with these digital modes.

Because of the faster pace of FT8 and particularly the FT4 digital mode, you'll be in for some lively action as hams call you not just on your frequency but from anywhere within the suggested sub-band for these modes. Once you begin your first response, the software takes over the next several sequences until you decide it's time to send the final '73' transmission. We'll look at the software windows that are unique to operating and review how to select the initial setup parameters to get you started. Once you've tuned up, checked your clock for the required accuracy, and started up the application, you'd better put your seatbelt on because there's going to be lots of operating action.

But wait, there's more! Web-based sites automatically receive reports from you and other hams every 7.5 or 15 seconds that enable you to see who can hear you on a navigable world map background. Logging your contacts and transferring the data to eQSL, LoTW, and your favorite master logging program will also be covered. Setting up the hardware interface between your computer and your transceiver will also be explored. Whether you are a beginner or a veteran ham, bring your ideas and success stories to the meeting because this is one exciting presentation that you won't want to miss.

Our April VE Test Session had five successful candidates, with their achievements of obtaining a license and upgrading a license class. Our electronic filing system once again worked superbly.


Our testing was conducted at our normal location at the Beaver County Emergency Services Center in Ambridge, PA. Our next VE Test Session will be on May 11th, 2023.

Brief Summary of our Special Event Station

Below are shown in a brief summary, our BVARA operating results for our week of operating activity using the Special Event Station call sign of W3S. Where it all started...Since 1952 Hamvention® has been sponsored by Dayton Amateur Radio Association (DARA). For many years it has been the world\'s largest amateur radio gathering, attracting hams from throughout the globe. About 1950, John Willig, W8ACE, had asked the Dayton Amateur Radio Association to sponsor a HAM Convention but was turned down. John wanted to have a quality affair. Speakers and prizes would be a drawing point. John finally found a champion in Frank Schwab, W8YCP (W8OK), the newly elected president of the club. A meeting was held and the DARA Board allocated \$100 to get started. The first organizational meeting was held in January 1952. The Southwestern Ohio Hamvention was born. The first committee consisted of: John Willig, W8ACE, General Chairman Al Dinsmore, W8AUN, Arrangements Bob Siff, W8QDI (K4AMG), Prizes and Exhibits Frank Schwab, W8YCP (W8OK), Publicity Bob Montgomery, W8CUJ, Finance Clem Wolford, W8ENH, Program Ellie Haburton, W8GJP (W4ZVW), Women\'s Committee. The next year the name became "Dayton Hamvention®" and was registered as a trademark. April was determined to be the best time but the Biltmore Hotel, in downtown Dayton was booked. March 22 was the chosen date, causing a short lead time. How far did \$100 go? Not far! A 12" TV was raffled off to help raise funds. The FCC agreed to give license exams and Phil Rand, W1BDM, a pioneer in TVI elimination was on the program. First prize, a Collins 75A2, was purchased locally. Hoping for 300 visitors, the committee was amazed that over 600 showed up! There were 7 exhibitors and 6 forums. The ladies program was successful with a luncheon at the Biltmore and a trip to a local TV station. In 1955 the Awards Program began with the "Amateur of the Year." The Flea Market has grown from 200 to more than 2000 spaces. In 1964 the Hamvention® moved to Hara Arena. Shuttle buses and handicapped parking were added in 1969. In 1973 it became a 2 day event with Sundays added in 1974. The growth of the Dayton Hamvention® can be attributed to caring, energetic people who enjoy being on a winning team.



The January 1923 issue of *QST Magazine* shows a young ham with a partially completed transmitter in the background with an empty tube socket. In his hands is a potential vacuum tube that he is thoughtfully considering to use in his construction project.

An article about Loop Transmission by Leon W. Bishop, 1XP presents the concept of using a loop antenna for local CW transmission on 275 meters (1091 KHz) at a Radio Show in Boston.

Another article described a call for entries for the annual trophy awarded by Secretary Hoover of the Department of Commerce for America's Best All-Around Amateur Station with very specific criteria.

The February 1923 issue shows 'Uncle Sam' congratulating an amateur operator for being The Transatlantic Hero while his YL or XYL fondly displays her pride for his accomplishment.



An article about The Transatlantic Triumph heralds the work done by the radio amateurs of Europe and America in the Third Transatlantic Tests of the American Radio Relay League.

A photo of the transmitter at 1ZE was used to send 14 complete messages over to England one night without repeats. The antenna current on 225 meters (1333 KHz) was 18 Amps!
