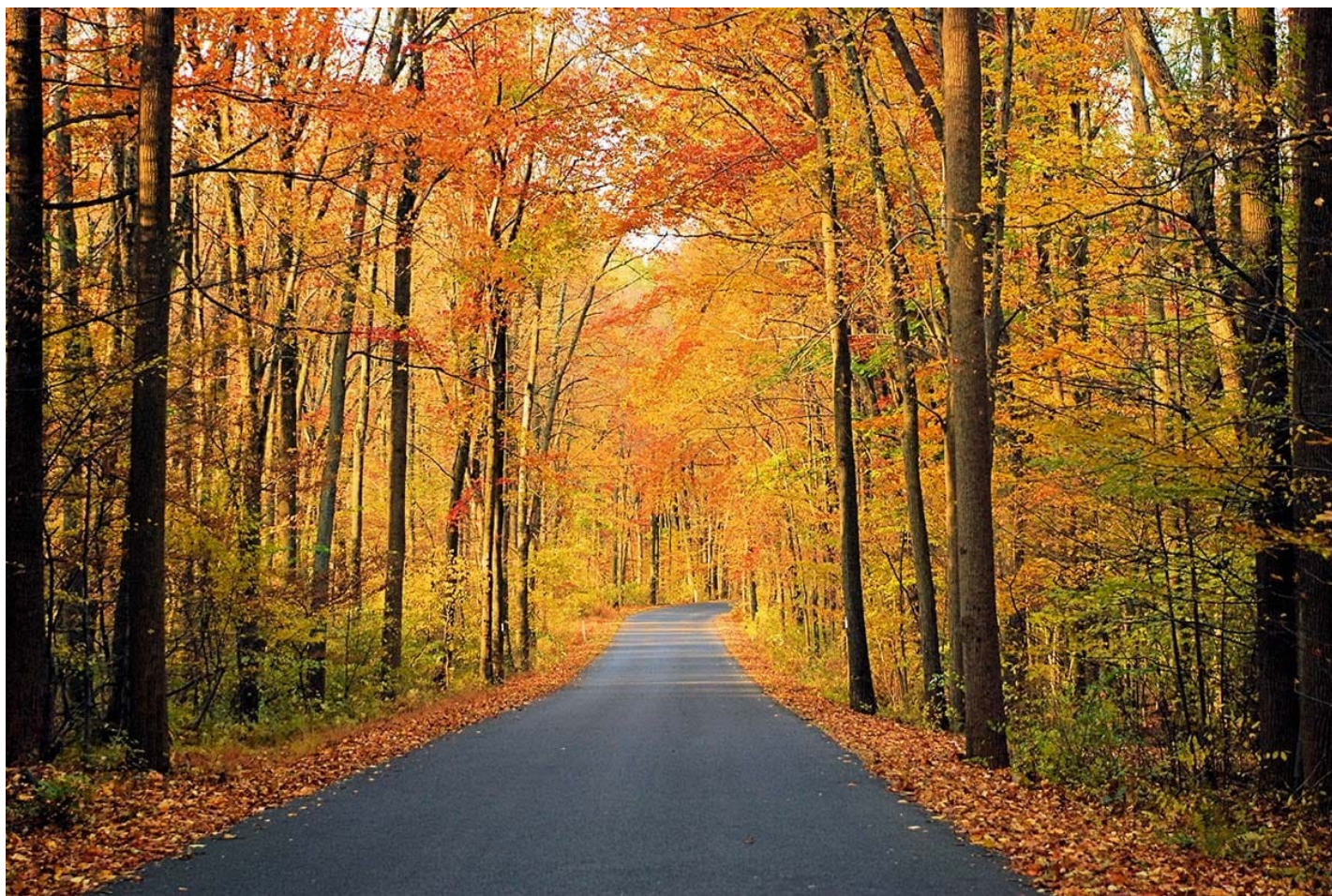

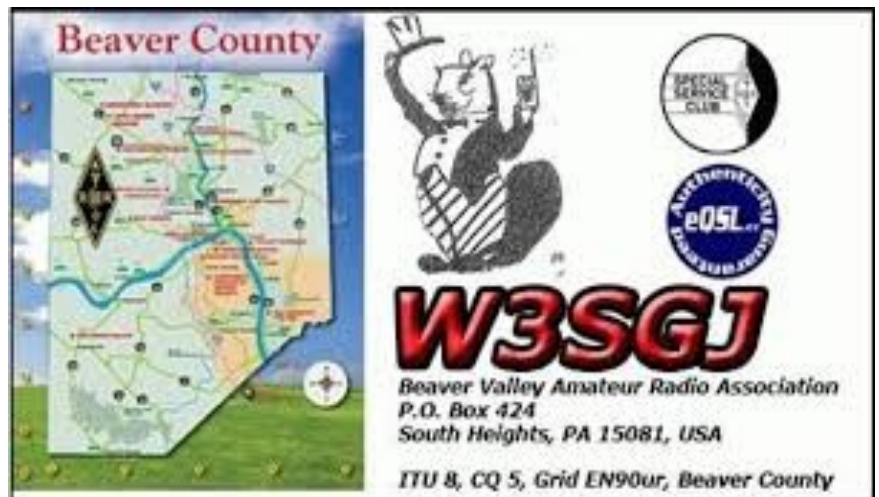

Topic:

Ionospheric Conditions
In Near Real Time

Including:

Continuing with our BVARA Presentation Series this year, our topic this month highlights a recently-developed tool that begins to close the gap between propagation forecasting based on coarse averaging of solar data that is derived from what happened in the last week or month or previous years that could tell us what might happen in the next week or so. Maybe! Perhaps I expect too much from science and physics, but I can't help but feel at times like we are in the dark ages with no accurate data or data that might be based on the wrong variables whose accuracy is questionable.

Scientists and physicists have been taking *Ionosondes* to measure the Ionosphere in great detail for many years. An ionosonde is used for finding the optimum operation frequencies for broadcasts or two-way communications in the high frequency range.

An *Ionogram* is a display of the data produced by an ionosonde. The data represent current conditions at one point above the surface of the earth. We'll talk about these in more detail to see how this begins to tie in to ham radio.

Recent international collaboration and developments have enabled the development of a useful online tool that is updated every 15 minutes to tell us about the global current propagation conditions. Two graphs will tell us the Maximum Usable Frequency (MUF) and the Critical Frequency that are updated every 15 minutes. The data tell us about NVIS, when a band is going long, and why a band is going short. The graphs will also tell us if a path is possible between two points on the earth at a particular frequency at the current time.

As we move further along on our climb to the top of Solar Cycle 25, this is one presentation you won't want to miss!

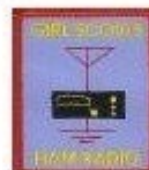

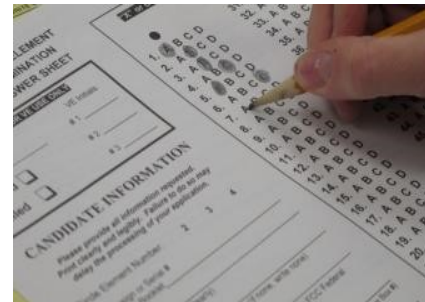

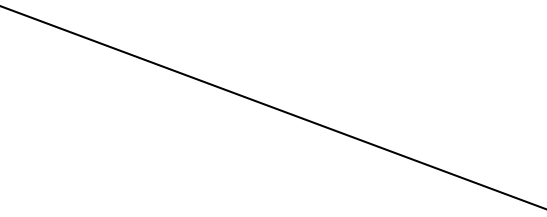

ALBERT BELARDIA (SK)

October 20, 1935 — September 27, 2022



Albert Belardia, 86, passed away on Tuesday (September 27, 2022) at his home in Aliquippa, PA. Al was born on October 20, 1935 in Elizabeth, PA, a 1954 graduate of McKees Rocks High School. On September 17, 1988 at the Assembly of God, Pittsburgh, he married Chong Sun Park, who survives.

He was a member of the Army Signal Corps serving from 1954 to 1956 and honorably discharged. Once out of the service Al spent his career working as a computer operator for Westinghouse at the Bettis Atomic Power Lab in West Mifflin, PA. He spent 40 years with them until his retirement in 1994.

Al, WA3GFM was an active member in the *Beaver Valley Amateur Radio Association* and spent hours reaching out to amateur radio operators all over the globe. He made friends with contacts in over 320 Countries and on every Continent. Al took pride as a Volunteer Examiner with active participation in over 100 sessions to aid people obtain their license and advance to higher levels of achievement. He was always pleasant, helpful, and courteous to everyone.

He loved to spend his time in the outdoors. Al was an avid hunter, camper, and fisherman.

Family and friends were received at the SIMPSON FUNERAL & CREMATION SERVICES, 1119 Washington Avenue, Monaca, PA, Tuesday October 4th from 4 to 6pm. Mass was celebrated at St John the Baptist Catholic Church, Monaca, Wednesday October 5th at 10am, followed with a burial service at the National Cemetery of the Alleghenies at 12:30 pm.
