

Topic:

My Projects Including: Design/Need, Purchase/Build, Current Status, Results, Lessons Learned

Including:

Continuing with our BVARA Presentation Series this year, our topic this month takes us 'One Step Beyond' by asking several of our club members to talk about one project. That project can be planned for the future, in purchase (parts or kit), putting it together, built, testing, or in current use. For those who seek knowledge in whatever form, here is an opportunity for you! If it's already finished, then what has been your experience with it? What would you change, if anything?

I'm expecting around five club members, more or less, to tell us what they're doing. Nothing formal, feel free to ask constructive questions of our fellow club members; a question starts a conversation, and others may also have questions too. Maybe a club member is stuck at one of the early stages. For example, where can I buy this widget, or can this be built from this or that? You get the idea. Maybe everything is there except for this one item.

To keep some boundaries around this, I suggest that once you start, I will give you an indication that 10 minutes are up and you have five more minutes to finish. That way, the other club members who have agreed to tell us about a project of theirs get an equal opportunity to show the club what they are working on or planning. My indicator is a Staples "*That was easy!*" button.

But wait, there's potentially more! My Wolf River Coil Antenna Evaluation Project took about three months to painstakingly collect real-time data, but I'll summarize some of the results. I'll also describe the performance of my QRP Labs QDX SDR QRP Transceiver. I gave a presentation on connecting a Quadra, a small PC no bigger than a pack of cigarettes, to an amazing software application called HamClock using a compact and efficient Linux Operating System. If there's still time, I'll describe the most recent project of an HD upgrade that I did to my Field Day PC with a new Samsung SSD and the performance improvement that I now enjoy. This will be one presentation that you won't want to miss!







THE STRONGEST FLARE YET (UPDATED AGAIN): Sunspot AR3842 exploded again on Oct. 3rd, producing the strongest solar flare of Solar Cycle 25 so far. NASA's Solar Dynamics Observatory recorded the X9.1-category blast:



Radiation from the flare ionized the top of Earth's atmosphere and caused a deep shortwave blackout over Africa and the South Atlantic. Ham radio operators in the area may have noticed loss of signal at frequencies below 30 MHz for as much as a half an hour after 12:18 UTC.

The explosion also produced <u>a halo CME</u>. Now that a full set of images has arrived from the Solar and Heliospheric Observatory (SOHO), it's clear that the CME is potent. NOAA forecasts of a strong geomagnetic storm when it arrives on Oct. 6th are probably correct. **CME impact alerts:** <u>SMS Text</u>

TWO CMEs ARE HEADING FOR EARTH: Confirmed: Two CMEs are now heading for Earth following consecutive X-flares (X7.1 and X9.1) from active sunspot AR3842. According to NOAA and NASA models, the first will strike Earth on **Oct 4th** and the second (more potent) will strike on **Oct. 6th**. The dual impacts could spark strong G3-class geomagnetic storms with auroras at mid-latitudes, especially on Oct. 6th. **CME impact alerts:** SMS Text


Groups.io

At the September club meeting I mentioned that the club has a page on groups.io. Groups.io is website that hosts e-mail reflectors, or groups, that may be of interest to people. Groups.io replaced the old Yahoo Groups when Yahoo decided to stop hosting web groups.


I had also mentioned that not many members have signed up for the club's group and how easy club communications would be if more members signed up. Well, one of the members suggested that I write a tutorial for signing up for the group, and here is my attempt at that.

If you already have a groups.io account, just search BVARA and you will find us. I have the old club patch design on the page (you know the one with yellow background, blue writing, and the tuxedo-wearing beaver).

If you don't have a groups.io account, signing up is easy. Point your favorite web browser to < https://groups.io/>. The page should look like this:



Look in the top right corner for "Sign Up" and sign up. The sign-up screen will look like this:



You have the option of signing up using your e-mail address and a password that you create, or using your Facebook or Google accounts to create a groups.io account.

Once you have a groups.io account search for BVARA and request to join. I have to approve memberships, so I will get an e-mail showing your request to join. This is the important part, BE PATIENT. I have a day job and they expect me to work on their stuff when I'm there. Once your membership is approved, you are all set. You can see old posts and post messages to the group. You can adjust settings to receive a new e-mail every time someone posts to the group or receive a daily digest of posts. You can also sign in to groups.io and browse the page at your leisure..

After you get on groups.io you can search for other groups that interest you. I think I am up to 33 groups that I have subscribed to. These include groups specific to the Icom 7300, Yaesu FT-817, Drake radios (yes, old tube equipment), Kenwood TH-D74 and -D75 (yes, I really own something from each of the "big three"), Wouxun radios, Baofeng (did I mention that I also have Chinese stuff?), and many more. Let your imagination run wild and you will probably find more
