PROCLAIMING JUNE 22<sup>ND</sup> THROUGH JUNE 24<sup>TH</sup>, 2012, AS
"AMATEUR RADIO WEEK"
IN BEAVER COUNTY.

WHEREAS, Amateur Radio has continued to provide a bridge between people, societies and countries by creating friendships and the sharing of ideas; and

**W**HEREAS, Amateur Radio Operators have also provided countless hours of community services throughout these decades; and

 $\mathbf{W}$ HEREAS, these Amateur Radio's services are provided wholly uncompensated; and

**W**HEREAS, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania also recognizes the services Amateur Radio's people also provide to our many Emergency Response organizations, including the Pennsylvania Emergency and Beaver County Emergency Management Agencies; and

 ${f W}$ HEREAS, these same individuals have further demonstrated their value in public assistance by providing free radio communications for local parades, bike-a-thons, walk-a-thons, fairs and other charitable public events; and




